



History of the Ohio Veterans Home Memorial Walkway

In May 2002, the Ohio Veterans Home Volunteer Advisory Committee approved the establishment of the Memorial Walkway for a two-fold purpose.

The initial cost of this project was \$12,500. Since its inception, more than 900 pavers have been engraved. Veterans from all branches of service and wars dating back to the Civil War have been recognized. A dated paver marks the beginning of each dedication year. It is followed by engraved pavers which are, for the most part, in alphabetical order.

Their priority was to create a place for OVH residents to be honored, both living and deceased, as well as organizations and individuals who are supporters of veterans to also be acknowledged.

The secondary purpose was to create additional revenue for the Ohio Veterans Home Resident Benefit Fund. The increased funds are to be used to further their mission of "serving those who served."
